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One Piece Baby Sweater

*Knit this ingenious sweater like a big square. Then by graphing together only 2 seams it becomes a baby sweater sweater with no finishing needed!

Finished chest measurements: 24"
Gauge: 3.75 sts / 5 rows = 1"
Keyplate 4
Bulky: Tension 5
Materials: chunky weight yarn: about 125 yards or 4 OZS



1. Open cast on 89 sts with waste yarn. Knit a few rows. Change to main yarn. Row counter at zeros.
2. Knit 3 rows.

3. With latch tool or crochet hook, convert 2nd and 3rd sts on each end to knit stitches.
 4. Continue to convert 2nd and 3rd end sts every other row. Knit to rc = 30.
 5. Cut yarn, leaving a tail. Bring forward to hold position 23 sts on each end.
 6. Lay a separate length of waste yarn about 24" long each across these sts on hold in hooks.
 7. One at a time, manually knit they sts. Repeat for other side. Sts are now back in working position.
 8. Beginning with a new end of main yarn, continue to convert end sts as before, every other row and knit to rc = 52.
 9. Back stitch bind off center 19 sts.
 10. Bring the needles opposite the carriage side to hold position.
 11. Working on side with carriage increase 1 st on neck edge every other row 3 times, then ewrap cast on 7 sts at neck edge.
 12. Knit to rc = 76 at the same time continuing to convert edge sts on both ends.
 13. Cut main yarn leaving a tail at least 30 " long.
 14. Knit off onto waste yarn. Repeat for other side.
 15. Hang row 1 of knitting above waste yarn, wrong side facing.
 16. Knit 2 rows with main yarn. Convert last row to knit sts.
 17. Repeat last step 2 times more. Bind off.
- Collar:
18. With right side facing, hang 40 sts on machine, starting and ending after the first 3 sts and before the last 3 sts.
 19. Knit to rc = 12 converting the 2nd and 3rd sts on each end to knit sts every other row.
 20. Knit 2 rows. Convert the last row to knit sts.
 21. Repeat last row. Bind off.
22. Unravel the contrasting scrap yarn in work, one stitch at a time and place on separate needles.
 23. Wrong sides together, fold the sleeve down so the live sts are together. Fold the front side of the sweater to the front.
 24. With tapestry needle, using kitchener stitch, and starting at cuff of one sleeve, graph the stitches together.
 25. Continue to graph the front of the sweater of that same side.
 26. Repeat for other side of sweater starting with sleeve cuff.
 27. Weave in Ends
